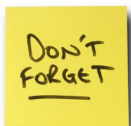

Guest speaker: Hermione was pleased to introduce not one, but four members of the Fire Crew from Kincumber Fire Brigade. Their talk was both informative in many areas giving us good detail about services available and telling us what we can do to protect ourselves and our property against fire. The Fire Brigade works in the areas of fire, rescues, storm damage and hazards. Operating smoke detectors are essential for home safety and advice was given on the best placement and use of these. Very useful information was given regarding protection for any who are hard of hearing. A strobe lighting alarm is available free to pensioners from the Deaf Society of NSW. Information can be found at www.fire.gov.nsw. We were told of the need for a fire evacuation plan and the action required to report a fire, exit the property and **not to return**. Care when cooking in the kitchen was emphasised, and we were invited to put our names on a list for fire alarm replacement by the Brigade when needed. If you ever have any questions you are able to visit the station to have your queries answered. It was a wonderful presentation filled with practical information, we received printed material to help us, and the fire truck was opened outside for us to inspect.

Profile report: Rob Capon recalled growing up in England during the war, speaking of various experiences including spending evenings in Air Raid shelters. His father served in the Air Force and eventually the family moved to Australia, largely influenced by a war time friendship his father had with an Australian. In 1965 he met his wife, married in 1966 - now enjoying their family of two sons and one grandson. Various business ventures contributed to a colourful and successful life while living in Berowra. Their subsequent retirement to Alloura Waters is a happy move. They enjoy their life now and all its activities.
